limb to the top of Iroha Slope and see Okunikko's majestic nature, with its mountains, rivers, waterfalls, lakes, and swamps, spread out before your eyes. The regions geographic features were formed by volcanic activities and owing rivers into a shape reminiscent of the three-tiered doll stand used in the Japanese Doll Festival held in March. Lake Chuzenji is on the first tier, Senjogahara Moor on the second, and Lake Yuno-ko on the third. The differences in elevations create natural habitats for a variety of plants and animals. Okunikko has been a center of tourism since the 1960's and was designated as a National Park in 1972. The four seasons are each unique in their beauty. In 1934 Okunikko was designated as Nikko National Park in order to preserve it as a representative scenic place in Japan and promote its utilization. Okunikko shows a different side of itself in each of the four seasons. We hope you will take this map and enjoy a hike here.
